"Kayaking for Youth and Elders" took place over a sunny fiveday stretch in August, ending with an overnight camping trip. The youth participants learned about kayaking, responsible camping and fire safety from local guides Luke and Kye Borserio, while the Haida elder shared traditional knowledge through song, a fire circle and quality time. Everyone enjoyed berry picking and pitched in to help clean up garbage from the beaches. Many of the youth said learning how to roll over in the kayak was the hearted "yes" when

asked if they would like to participate in a program like this again.

The Ngystle Society applied for a Gwaii Trust Youth Grant to make the kayaking program possible. Our youth board - which reviews and makes decisions on all youth grants - approved the application, enthusiastic about its potential to create meaningful connections between youth, elders and nature, and intercultural understanding and respect.
