We offered this mentorship to Shellene Van der Beke, owner of the Haida Gwaii Trader, and she has been working with the website developer on the construction of our new site. In the process, she will be learning many skills that will assist her with the ongoing management of the Trader website. For Shellene, it's an amazing opportunity.

"You'd think that as a small business owner running a website that I'd have lots of knowledge about website development, but in fact, I don't," she said. "I've always hired other people for this type of work. Thus, the opportunity to work with the Gwaii Trust website redesign mentorship is proving to be hugely valuable!"
